March Meeting (3/21)

It's time for Bordeaux wine tasting. Ok, what wines are considered to be of the Bordeaux variety? I've asked our club wine experts and they say:

Bordeaux varietals include Merlot, Cab Sauv, Cab Franc, Malbec, Petit Verdot, and Carmenère. Additionally: "Blended red wines similar to those of Bordeaux are also known in America as "Meritage" (rhymes with "heritage"). A red Meritage is made from a blend of two or more of the following varieties: Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Malbec, Petit Verdot, Carmenère, St. Macair and Gros Verdot."

As the tastings are aimed at helping members learn and be more confident in developing pallets and having fun. Craig and Rick are planning to use judging sheets for each wine. The tasting will be monitored so to speak and ensure that everyone gets a chance to speak. Again, the club is about improving your wine making skills. Another item for the tastings; with the size of the club, please bring two bottles of your wine if you bringing wine to taste. Several times we have had too big a group for one bottle to make it around for all to try. For example, we had over 50 people attend the February meeting. If we don't need it, you have it to take back home (or you could give it to another deserving club member). \odot
